A New Horror Unfolds

On Sept. 26 Typhoon Ondoy ravaged the Philippines with flooding. It unleashed record rainfalls of nearly 18 inches in a 24-hour period. A month's worth of rain submerged 80% of Manila in less than 12 hours. Over 3 million Filipinos were affected by the storm, watching their neighborhoods get swept away. The storm has destroyed and damaged houses and washed away what few possessions they had. Now the streets are lined with garbage and debris, creating unsafe and unhealthy conditions, especially for children. Now, with so many people displaced from their simple makeshift dwellings, water-borne diseases and starvation have escalated to alarming levels.

And then there is the mud. Mud is everywhere, covering everything left, and the storm victims have no where to go. Temporary relief shelters are bursting at the seams trying to serve the poor, and available resources and local authority response capacities are stretched beyond their limits.

Our Filipino brothers and sisters need our help desperately. We have already responded by sending some additional food to Manila and by diverting 270,800 meals to the city from our shipments to the outlying dioceses of the Philippines. That action comes at a severe cost to those dioceses, as it means that they have to go without food.

Will you help? Shipping additional emergency food to Manila is exhausting RSM's financial resources, and yet the starving children we have been so successful in serving at our feeding sites throughout the Philippines still need our help, too. It is overwhelming, but we have to try. Help us raise \$100,000 to provide food relief for these typhoon victims, because for them the worst is yet to come -- 425,000 people trying to survive despite losing what little means they had just to make it through the day.

Together we can rush to their aid.
